Get to Know the BLPA

If you have spoken with any of our long term volunteers about our history, you likely have heard of the *Group of Ten*, who founded what the BLPA is today. Leading the charge was **Bob Gardner** (1927-2002), an educator in the Burnaby School



District 41. As he tells it, our history combines the background of science education as well as the ability and luck in successfully receiving grant money to fund activities. Bob was a member of the BC Biology Curriculum Revision Committee and became the chairperson of the Outdoor Education Committee of the BATS – the Burnaby Association of Teachers of Science. In 1971, he learned of a government funded Local Initiative Program (LIP). With a source of funding, Bob gathered interested community members in January 1972, and formed the **Burnaby Outdoor Education Association (BOEA)*** and he became the Project Director. From 1972 to 1996, he secured 6 LIP grants, 8 Job Creation Grants and other funds to plan and build the trail around Burnaby Lake and the original viewing tower as well as convert the house at 4519 Piper Avenue into the Nature House. Bob Gardner has left the community a legacy that we see each time we are in the park. To see a video of our history, visit **burnabylakepark.ca/about/history**.

Weedbusters Progress

From April to July, the BLPA has held 10 Weedbuster work parties at various sites throughout Burnaby Lake Regional Park. Some information of note:


 With 3 work parties left in 2018, we have surpassed the 2017 total weight of invasive species removed: 4215 kg vs 4319 kg in 2018 so far

- Our April Weedbuster happened to fall on Earth Day, and we had several people come out specifically because they wanted to do something for the environment on this day, including one person who took time from his holidays from Ontario!
- While the majority of our volunteers are from Burnaby, we welcomed community members from across Metro Vancouver from West Vancouver to the Tri-Cities.
- While we go after the "usual suspects" of invasive species, English ivy, Scotch broom, Himalayan blackberry, Himalayan balsam, a few Black locust or False acacia (Robinia pseudoacacia)

environmental stewardship. It's led by youth for youth - check them out to learn more.

EcoBlitz 2018



The first EcoBlitz was held in 2014 and was a one day event across the Metro Vancouver Regional Parks System. It was an opportunity for the community to lend a helping hand to nature and show a little extra love to our Regional Park. In 2014 and 2015, we removed invasive species from an area known as the North Avalon Restoration Site (NARS). In 2016, we received a George Ross Legacy Grant for \$4000 to purchase new tools and 218 native species to plant in NARS. We also planted native species around Piper Spit that year and went back to plant more in 2017 as well as the area between the Avalon lot and the Lake.

Now in its fifth year, the BLPA is happy to be able to host two EcoBlitz events on **Sunday, October 14** and **Sunday, October 21**, (1:00-4:00 pm). On the 21st, we are working with TD to deliver a **TD Tree Days event**. Registration details will be posted on our social media soon or contact Ann at info@burnabylakepark.ca.


